

Venerable Jean Gailhac Celebration of the entrance into Full Life

In the northern hemisphere the traditional period for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is January 18-25. Today is the last day of this week, the day we celebrate the Conversion of St. Paul.

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles (9, 3-6.8.12.17.19-20)

- In those days ... Saul, on his journey, as he was nearing Damascus, a light from the sky suddenly flashed around him.
 He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him:
- JC "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?"
- S "Who are you, Sir?"
- JC "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting.Now get up and go into the city and you will be told what you must do."
- Saul got up from the ground, but when he opened his eyes he could see nothing.
 In a vision, Saul has seen a man named Ananias come in and lay his hands on him, that he may regain his sight.
 Ananias went and entered the house; laying his hands on him, he said:
- An "Saul, my brother, the Lord has sent me,
 Jesus who appeared to you on the way by which you came,
 that you may regain your sight and be filled with the holy Spirit".
- Immediately things like scales fell from his eyes and he regained his sight.
 He got up and was baptized and when he had eaten, he recovered his strength.
 Saul stayed some days with the disciples in Damascus and he began at once to proclaim Jesus in the synagogues, that he is the Son of God.

The death of the Holy Priest



As Gailhac's life was drawing to a close, his "spiritual friend," Abbé Jean, wrote him words of consolation and peace:

Your whole life has been consecrated to God's service. When you gave yourself to the good God, it was agreed that you would give yourself entirely on condition that God would make you a saint and let you work at forming holy people. You have kept your promise. God will keep His.

I know your soul as well and better than you and that is why I have the right to say to you again: "Pax Christi!" You know that the good God has made our hearts and souls inseparable, that I am always united with you, that it is the divine Master who confided your soul to my care.

It is then with all His authority that I say to you: remain in peace. You are His friend. He watches over you and over the works He has confided to you... Remain confident and abandoned.

On Thursday, January 23, 1890, M. St. Felix asked Father Gailhac if he had a "little word" that she could pass on to the Institute.

"Yes", Gailhac said at once,

"Union... union, charity... All, all, always."

When Father Gailhac died, a clamor arose in the town of Béziers that could be heard everywhere:

"The holy priest! The holy priest is dead!"


